POPE FRANCIS. RIP

Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina on 17th December 1936, died in Rome on 21st April, 2025.

Pope Francis served as the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church from March 2013 to April 2025. The first pope from the Americas, Francis took his papal title after Saint Francis of Assisi of Italy. Prior to his election as pope, he spent more than a decade as cardinal of the Roman Catholic Church of Argentina and Archbishop of Buenos Aires. Francis was also president of the Bishops' Conference of Argentina from 2005 to 2011. Named Person of the Year by Time magazine in 2013, Pope Francis' tenure was characterized by humility and outspoken support of the world's poor and marginalized people. He also advocated for peace and the protection of the environment. After months of declining health, Pope Francis died in April 2025 at age 88.

Some quotes from Pope Francis:

- God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy.
- · You can, you must try to seek God in every human life. Although the life of a person is a land full of thorns and weeds, there is always a space in which the good seed can grow. You have to trust God.
- · Mercy will always be greater than any sin, no one can put a limit on the love of the all-forgiving God.
- · You could say to me, 'But the Church is made up of sinners; we see them every day.' And this is true: we are a Church of sinners. And we sinners are called to let ourselves be transformed, renewed, sanctified by God.
- We are impatient, anxious to see the whole picture, but God lets us see things slowly, quietly.
- · We must always walk in the presence of the Lord, in the light of the Lord, always trying to live in an irreprehensible way.
- Dear young people do not be afraid of making decisive choices in life. Have faith; the Lord will not abandon you!
- · From my point of view, God is the light that illuminates the darkness, even if it does not dissolve it, and a spark of divine light is within each of us." Eternal Rest grant unto him, Oh Lord. Amen
